The Lost Rock Art of Glen Canyon and the San Juan River



In January 1963 the Glen Canyon Dam in Utah closed and the waters began to rise. When the full pool was reached, scores of rock art and other archeological sites were flooded and lost from sight. But they will rise again from their watery grave during this lecture and slide show at this meeting, since our guest Steven Hughes was there with his father in 1960-61 and photographed these sites. He will share about 200 photos of 24 rock art sites.

In addition to the photographs Steven will show the locations on the pre-flood and full pool topographic maps and on Google Earth satellite image.

Few among us had the privilege of witnessing these sites, so do not miss this chance for a rare viewing.

He has been an active field archaeologist for nearly 40 years as owner and director of Grand River Institute, where he has conducted numerous site testing, evaluation, and excavation projects as well as cultural sources surveys covering tens of thousands of acres in Colorado and Utah

Carl will discuss excavations within two sites near Meeker produced radiocarbon dates ca. 1700 BP that place bison hunters in Northwest Colorado around AD 300.
